We are looking for an experienced and dynamic choral conductor, with a proven track record in developing mixed-voice adult chamber choirs.

Our Conductor and Artistic Director will be responsible for rehearsing and preparing the choir for performance, and to lead and conduct our events and concerts. We are looking for someone keen to plan and propose future programmes to drive our aspirations and stimulate the choir's further development, whilst maintaining the high standards we seek.

The Exon Singers has an established tradition of commissioning and premiering new choral works, and its commissions have contributed a significant body of work to the cathedral repertoire over the last 20 years. In addition, we have been regular contributors to the Choral Evensong "slot" on BBC Radio 3 for the last 40 years. We would wish our Conductor and Artistic Director to have a keen interest in continuing this practice.

Whilst our concerts are often a cappella or with keyboard accompaniment, we would ideally like our Conductor and Artistic Director to have connections in the professional musical world to attract high-quality professional soloists and instrumentalists should this be required.

We are very interested in ways that a new Conductor and Artistic Director's specific experience and knowledge can add to and broaden the choir's musical range and repertoire.

About the post

The post of Conductor and Artistic Director of the Exon Singers is honorary, with travel expenses paid in some circumstances. It requires a commitment to programming and directing our annual summer Festival in Tavistock, Devon, in late July/early August each year, and one or two other projects during the year, depending on availability of singers.

The choir is made up of singers from all over the UK, invited by recommendation, and we are proud to nurture exceptional young talent alongside many professional musicians and music teachers, all of whom give their time and goodwill freely. In recent years all monies made have been ploughed back into commissioning new music or recording CDs. The choir celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2016. The Festival forms the centre of our work, and for each project we gather, rehearse intensively and then perform or record. It is an ideal opportunity for professional development for an energetic and ambitious choral director.

Brief information about the Exon Singers

THE EXON SINGERS, founded in 1966, is recognised as one of the UK's leading chamber choirs. It has become renowned for its dynamic and expressive performances of music from the Renaissance to the present day, with reviews describing the choir's performances as "brilliantly sung" (Classic FM), with "beautifully tailored singing" (Gramophone), and a "brilliant soprano sound" (The Daily Telegraph), where "The Exon Singers excel" (BBC Music Magazine).

The choir broadcasts regularly on BBC Radios 3 and 4 and has made a number of highly acclaimed recordings for Albany, ASV, Delphian, Regent and Rubicon Classics record labels. The choir's Artistic Director and Conductor is Richard Wilberforce. Richard succeeded Matthew Owens, under whose direction the choir received considerable recognition for its commitment to commissioning new works from some of today's most exciting composers – Brian Chapple, Gary Davison, Joseph Phibbs, Richard Allain, David Briggs, Grayston Ives, Francis Jackson, Gabriel Jackson, Howard Skempton, Philip Moore, Philip Wilby, Matthew Martin and Robin Holloway. The choir welcomed James Burton as Composer in Residence for the 2015 Festival and Toby Young in 2017, and its final project under the direction of Richard Wilberforce will be a recording of the choral music of Toby Young.

Since 1973, the annual Exon Singers Festival has been based in the historic market town of Tavistock on the edge of Dartmoor, and includes the beautiful venues of Tavistock Parish Church and Buckfast Abbey. The annual Festival involves both concerts and the leading of Christian worship. It is based within a parish church community, and we work closely with a volunteer committee from the parish to enable the rehearsing, performing, accommodation and hospitality in Tavistock. The choir's festival performances include the Oxford Festival of Contemporary Music and the Edinburgh Festival, as well as concerts in St John's College, Cambridge, Gloucester Cathedral, Wells Cathedral and at venues in Winchester, Salisbury and Belfast.

The 52nd Exon Singers Festival will run from Tuesday 31st July to Sunday 5th August 2018 and will include a Come and Sing Workshop Day on Saturday 28th July, preparing music to celebrate the 700th Anniversary of St Eustachius Parish Church in Tavistock at the Opening Concert of the Festival, using the combined forces of the Exon Festival Chorus with the Exon Singers.

- Auditioning prospective singers;

- Assisting with audience development and the commercial success of concerts through appropriate choice of programmes;
- Making recommendations to the Committee for the engagement of soloists and other performers as required;
- Fixing soloists and performers where required.

- 1. A skilful and inspiring choir trainer, with outstanding musicianship, demonstrated by proven experience and academic qualifications.
- 2. Vision and ambition for the future development of the choir.
- 3. Experience of training adult mixed-voice choirs.

- 5. Ability to provide sensitive leadership for the choir to maintain current high standards and facilitate its future development.
- 6. High levels of energy, enthusiasm and passion for choral music and the ability to transmit this to choir members and audiences.
- 7. A good sense of humour, excellent communication and organizational skills and good time management skills within rehearsal.
- 8. Ability to foster, build and develop successful, productive working relationships both within the choir and with volunteer committee members and financial supporters elsewhere.
- 9. Broad musical outlook, with a wide knowledge of choral music from different eras and countries.
- 10. Ability to plan and structure programmes and festivals to interest and challenge the choir.
